MD-1 Constitution

ARTICLE VII

DISTRICT ORGANIZATION

Whereas; Lions Clubs International has mandated required changes to ALL the Sub-District level constitution(s), and

Whereas; Changes to a Multiple District Constitution, a Multiple District Constitution such as the Lions of Illinois, Inc has, SHOULD reflect those changes

Therefore; In an effort to reflect the most current changes mandated by LCI for Sub-District Constitutions, it is resolved that the following changes be made to the entire Article VII, District Organization, Sections 1-10, as follows

ARTICLE VII

DISTRICT ORGANIZATION

Section I. New Section .

Section 1. OFFICERS. Each district shall have a district cabinet composed of the district governor, the immediate past district governor, the first and second vice district governors, the region chairpersons (if the position is utilized during the district governor's term), the zone chairpersons, Global Membership Team district coordinator, Global Leadership Team district coordinator, Global Service Team district coordinator, LCIF district coordinator, a cabinet secretary-treasurer or a cabinet secretary and a cabinet treasurer, and such other club members as may be included in this section as amended in accordance with the amendment procedures contained herein. Each such cabinet member shall be a member in good standing of a Lions club in good standing in the district.

OLD Section 1. (new Section 2) (Remaining sections being renumbered accordingly)

Section 2. Each District shall be administered by its duly selected District Governor. Each District Governor shall appoint within thirty days after officially taking office, or the district shall have elected, a District Cabinet, consisting of a Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer, Global Membership Team district coordinator, Global Leadership Team district coordinator, Global Service Team district coordinator, LCIF district coordinator a Region Chairperson for each Region within the District (for those Districts retaining the optional position of Region Chairperson) and a Zone Chairperson for each Zone within the District. The District Cabinet shall also include the Immediate Past District Governor, the 1st Vice District Governor and 2nd Vice District Governor as voting members. The Individual Districts may, by vote of the District Cabinet, include as members of the District Cabinet any Past District Governor or Governors, Past International officers or Directors and Chairpersons of District Committees, with or without voting rights, if the language and procedure is provided in the sub district constitution for such action.

Each officer appointed by the District Governor or elected by the district shall be a member in good standing of a chartered Lions Club in the District. The District Governor shall have the right to remove any appointed officer for good and sufficient reasons. Members of the District Cabinet other than the District Governor, First Vice District Governor and Second Vice District Governor may be removed from office for cause by the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the entire number of the District Cabinet and any vacancy in the District Cabinet may be filled by appointment by the District Governor.

Section 3. The District Cabinet shall meet at such times and places as may be fixed by the District Governor, and a majority of the voting members of the Cabinet shall constitute a quorum at any cabinet meeting.

Section 4. For the purpose of efficiency, economy and stimulation of action, each District shall be divided by its District Governor into Regions of 16 or less Clubs each, and each Region into Zones of 8 or less, due regard being given to geographical locations of the Clubs, which divisions shall be subject to change by the District Governor as may be deemed advisable for the best interests of Lionism and the individual Clubs.

Section 5 The District Governor of each District shall be elected either at the annual District Convention or at the annual State Convention as determined by the District Cabinet, by the delegates of the Clubs in the District, and shall take office immediately on adjournment of the following International Convention. A meeting of the registered delegates of the district in attendance at the annual convention of the multiple district of which this district shall be a part may constitute the annual convention of the district (provided the multiple district convention occurs at least 30 days before the convening date of the International Convention). The elections shall be conducted as provided in Article I, Section 4 of the By-Laws.

A candidate for the office of District Governor shall be an active member in good standing of a chartered Lions Club in good standing, in his/her Sub-District, shall secure the endorsement of his/her Club or a majority of the Clubs in his/her Sub-District, and shall currently be serving as the 1st Vice District Governor within the Sub-District. Only in the event the current 1st Vice District Governor does not stand for election as District Governor, or if a vacancy in the position of 1st Vice District Governor exists at the time of the Sub-District Convention, the 2nd Vice District Governor may stand for election as District Governor. In the event the current 2nd Vice District Governor does not stand for election as District Governor, or if a vacancy in the position of 2nd Vice District Governor exists at the time of the Sub-District Convention, then any Club member who fulfills the qualifications for the office of 2nd Vice District Governor as provided in the following Section 9 of this Article VI who is currently serving or who has served one (1) additional year as a member of the Cabinet, shall fulfill the foregoing requirement that he/she shall currently be serving as the 1st Vice District Governor within the Sub-District, and shall therefore, be eligible to stand for election as District Governor.

Section 6. The officers of each District, in addition to the District Governor, the Immediate Past District Governor, the 1st Vice District Governor, the 2nd Vice District Governor, the Cabinet Secretary-Treasurer, the Global Membership Team district coordinator, Global Leadership Team district coordinator, Global Service Team district coordinator, LCIF district coordinator, the Region Chairpersons and the Zone Chairpersons. shall include the Presidents and Secretaries of each Club in the District.

There shall be a District Governor's Advisory Committee in each Zone composed of the Zone Chairperson and the Presidents and Secretaries of the Clubs in the Zone. The Zone Chairperson in each Zone shall arrange and conduct such number of Zone Advisory Committee meetings during the year in which he/she holds office as required or recommended by Lions Clubs International, but in no event less than three.

Section 7. There may be in each District a District Governor's Honorary Committee composed of Past International Officers, Past International Directors and Past District Governors within the District. The Chairperson of the Committee shall be appointed by the District Governor, and the Committee shall meet when and as called upon to meet by the District Governor or by its Chairperson.

Section 8. An election for the offices of 1st Vice District Governor and 2nd Vice District Governor shall be conducted at the same time and place as the District Governor is elected, and are to take office immediately on adjournment of the International Convention and serve until the adjournment of the following International Convention. The result of such elections shall be reported to the International Office by the current District Governor.

Section 9. A candidate for the office of 1st Vice District Governor shall:

(a) Be an Active Member in good standing of a chartered Lions Club in good standing in his/her Sub-District.

(b) Secure the endorsement of his/her Club or a majority of the Clubs in his/her Sub-District.

(c) Have served or will have served at the time he/she takes office as 1st Vice District Governor:

 As President of a Lions Club for a full term or major portion thereof, and a member of the Board of Directors of a Lions Club for no less than two (2) additional years, and

(2) As Zone Chairperson or Region Chairperson or Cabinet Secretary and/or Treasurer for a full term or major portion thereof.

(3) As 2nd Vice District Governor for a full term, or the majority thereof, except a candidate for 1st Vice District Governor for service in 2009-2010 shall not be required to serve as 2nd Vice District Governor.

(4) With none of the above being accomplished concurrently.

Section10. A candidate for the office of 2nd Vice District Governor shall:

(a) Be an Active Member in good standing of a chartered Lions Club in good standing in his/her Sub-District.

(b) Secure the endorsement of his/her Club or a majority of the Clubs in his/her Sub-District.

(c) Have served or will have served at the time he/she takes office as 2nd Vice District Governor:

 As President of a Lions Club for a full term or major portion thereof, and a member of the Board of Directors of a Lions Club for no less than two (2) additional years, and

(2) As Zone Chairperson or Region Chairperson or Cabinet Secretary and/or Treasurer for a full term or major portion thereof.

(3) With none of the above being accomplished concurrently.

ARTICLE X

STATE REVENUE

Whereas; Lion of Illinois, Inc is a registered not for profit corporation with the Illinois Secretary of State Office, and

Whereas; Lions of Illinois, Inc is a registered entity with both the State and Federal IRS agencies, holding independent tax identification with both agencies, and

Whereas; Lions of Illinois, Inc is also is registered with the Illinois Department of Unemployment Services as well as the Department of Employment Services (Federal), and

Whereas; Lions of Illinois, Inc is responsible to annually establish its own independent, <u>General Rules of Re-imbursement</u> as part of its the budgeting process

Therefore: Be it resolved that the following changes be made to Article X, Section 1, Paragraph 3.

Section 1. PARAGRAPH 3

One Dollar and Fifty Cents (\$1.50) per capita of said fund shall be available for use for this State's participation in the International Convention. Expenses of each out-going District Governor in connection with his/her attending the International Convention at or near the conclusion of his/her term of office shall be considered a proper charge against this International Convention Fund. and Reimbursement for said expenses of such outgoing District Governors out of this fund shall be on the same basis as that allowed District Governors Elect under the Rules of Audit of and by Lions Clubs International according to the General Rules of Reimbursement as adopted by the Council of Governors each year.

MD-1 By-Laws

ARTICLE III

STANDING COMMITTEES

Whereas; Lions Club International has made changes to the Membership (GMT), Leadership (GLT), Lions International Foundation Chairperson positions at all levels AND added a Service Chairperson (GST) as well as a Global Action Team structure throughout the organization, and

Whereas; Lions of Illinois, Inc has also made changes within their own State Committees over the past few years, and

Whereas; The MD-1 Constitution should reflect those changes,

Therefore: Therefore be it resolved that Article III, Standing Committees, Sections 1-10 be changed and re-ordered as follows.

Section 1. The State Council shall establish such Standing Committees as shall be deemed necessary to properly administer the affairs of Lionism within the State which are not at that time being administered by the Lions of Illinois Foundation. Such Standing Committees may include Constitution and By-Laws, Membership Development Global Action Committee [consisting of a Global Membership Team (GMT), Global Leadership Team (GLT) and Global Service Team (GST)], Finance, International Convention, State Redistricting, State Magazine, Diabetes Education and Research, Drug Awareness, Leadership Development, Leo Clubs and Youth Activities, Lioness, Lions Clubs International Foundation, Long Range Planning Committee and Campaign and Liaison. Each such Standing Committee, except Campaign and Liaison, and Long Range Planning Committee and the State Finance Committee, shall be composed of one member from each District appointed by the District Governor of the District, and each member shall have one vote in committee deliberations. Unless otherwise appointed by LCI or approved for terms of more than one year, the Chairperson of each Standing committee shall be appointed annually by the State Council (with the approval of LCI if necessary), and with the exception of the Chairperson of the Long Range Planning Committee, who will be the Immediate Past Council Chairperson. Members of each Standing Committee shall be appointed annually, except as is hereinafter provided for the Constitution and By-Laws Committee, the Campaign and Liaison Committee, the Long Range Planning Committee, Global Action Committee Chairpersons and the Finance Committee and the Membership Development Committee, ALL Committee Chairpersons shall report regularly to the State Council as required. Any policy procedure to be adopted by a Standing Committee shall first be submitted to the State Council for its approval, and the budget of each Standing Committee which adopts a budget shall be subject to approval by the State Council. With the exception of the Long Range Planning Committee, in order to be eligible for appointment as Chairperson of a Standing Committee, the appointee shall have served as a District Chairperson of that Committee for at least one (1) year. However, in the event that no application is received for a State Chairperson position, or the Council is not in favor of any applications received for a particular committee, the Council may waive the one year eligibility requirement and appoint a Lion to fill the position.

Section 2. The members of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee shall be appointed for a two-year term with members from Districts 1-A, 1-CN, 1-G, 1-J and 1-M being appointed in odd-numbered years. Members from Districts 1-BK, 1-CS, 1-D, 1-F, and 1-H shall be appointed in even-numbered years. Members from possible newly-created Districts shall be alternately appointed as above in the order of district creation beginning with even numbered years. This Committee shall consider all matters of constitutional change which it may originate or which may be referred to it. Section 3. The State Chairperson of any committee, (except an MD-1 Host Committee and its hosting of an International Convention or USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum in Illinois), which promotes collection and transmission of moneys from Lions Clubs, or any other person or organization, shall have all such moneys remitted directly to the State Office by the Lions Club, Lion, or any other person or organization.

Section 4. The State Council shall provide for audits of all Committees which handle monies as outlined in Section 3, such audits to be made annually, or at more frequent internals if necessary, by a competent auditor and shall cause copies of such audits in summary form to be published in the State Magazine or to be mailed to the President or Secretary

Section 5. The Campaign and Liaison Committee shall be created to operate on behalf of the State and with other such similar organizations of other states or countries. This Committee shall be composed of all past and present International Directors, who were elected from Multiple District 1; and who are members in good standing of a Club in this State, the Chairperson of the Council of Governors, and one Past District Governor from each District, appointed by the District Governor for a two-year term with Members from Districts 1-A, 1-CN, 1-G, 1-J and 1-M being appointed in odd-numbered years. Members from Districts 1-BK, 1-CS, 1-D, 1-F, and 1-H shall be appointed in even-numbered years. Members from possible newly-created Districts shall be alternately appointed as above in the order of district creation beginning with even-numbered years. The Chairperson of the Committee, appointed by the State Council, shall serve as the official spokesman of the committee. At all meetings of the Committee a majority of the members of the Committee appointed in each district by the District Governor, or their alternates as hereinafter provided, shall constitute a quorum. If any appointed member is not present at any meeting, the District Governor is not able to serve as the alternate the District Governor-Elect shall serve as an alternate member of the Committee. The actions of the Official Spokesman shall be governed by the rule of the majority of this Committee.

Section 6. The Membership Development Committee shall be composed of one member from each district, appointed by the District Governor of the District, for a three (3) year term.

Members from Districts 1-A, 1-CS, 1-F and 1-J will be appointed in 1989 for a three (3) year term and appointments will be made from these districts for three (3) year terms thereafter.

Members from Districts 1-BK, 1-D, and 1-G will be appointed in 1989 for a two (2) year term and appointments will be made from these districts for three (3) year terms thereafter.

Members from Districts 1-CN, 1-H and 1-M will be appointed in 1989 for a one (1) year term and appointments will be made from these districts for three (3) year terms thereafter.

Members from possible newly created Districts shall be alternately appointed as above.

New Section 6. The Global Action Committee shall be composed of a Chairperson who shall be the current Council Chairperson and a State Coordinator for each category of Multiple District Coordinator as currently designated by Lions Clubs International for Multiple District Administration of the Global Action Sub Committees (Currently a Global Membership Chairperson, Global Leadership Chairperson, Global Service Chairperson). Each District will supply a District Chairperson for each category as identified in this section. NO Lion shall occupy the Chairpersonship for more than one category of office under this committee structure (GLT, GMT, GST). Terms for these chair positions will be defined by Lions Clubs International (currently 3 years for State Chairpersons and 1 year for District Chairpersons). Each Multiple District Coordinator is responsible for their District Chairpersons only and will report to the Council Chairperson for direction from the Council as well as meet at least once a year with their District Chairpersons to coordinate their individual goals, issues and activities. Each Multiple District Coordinator is also responsible (along with the Council Chairperson) for reporting to their individual Area Leader.

Section 7. The members of the Long Range Planning Committee shall serve a two year term commencing with the Immediate Past District Governors of 1997-1998 all serving year one during 1998-1999. Then, Immediate Past District Governors from Districts 1-A, 1-BK, 1-CN, 1-F, and 1-G will serve two year terms beginning in odd-numbered years, and Immediate Past District Governors from Districts 1-CS, 1-D, 1-H, 1-J and 1-M will serve two year terms beginning in even numbered years. Members from possible newly-created Districts shall be alternately appointed as above in the order of District creation beginning with even numbered years. The Immediate Past Council Chairperson shall serve as Chairperson of this Committee. If none is available, then a Chairperson will be elected by the Committee. This Committee shall identify long term goals and address current issues of the Lions of Illinois and will advise and assist the Council of Governors and standing State Committee Chairpersons in the implementation of these plans.

Section 8. There shall be established a standing Finance Committee composed of five (5) Illinois Lions appointed by the Council of Governors to three year terms. Initially the Council shall appoint two Lions to three year terms, one Lion to a two year term and one Lion to a one-year term. Each Council will appoint successors to three year terms as the originally appointed members' terms expire. The fifth member of the Finance Committee will be the elected Council Treasurer who will serve a one year term during his/her term of office.

The current State Secretary-Treasurer shall be an ex officio, non-voting member of the Finance Committee; shall attend all meetings and shall provide all requisite financial and operational information to the Finance Committee as requested by the Finance Committee.

The Finance Committee, at its first meeting each Lions year, shall elect from among its members a Chairperson to serve for that year.

Section 9. In order that there may be equal representation for each District on all Standing Committees, except as otherwise herein provided with regard to the Campaign and Liaison Committee, there shall hereafter be no honorary or lifetime appointments to any committee.

(old Section 7) Section 10. The Chairperson of any Standing Committee may be removed at any time by any State Council for good cause shown, in which event a successor shall be appointed by the State Council for the remainder of the term of office. Any member of a Standing Committee may be removed at any time for cause by the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the entire number of the District Cabinet by their respective District Governor for good cause shown, in which event a successor shall be appointed by the District Governor for the term of office.

Resolution to State Committee Term Limits

As presented by the Rockford Lions Club, Inc. aka Rockford Noon Lions

WHERE AS the State Committee members are encouraged to actively participate in discussions, decisions, and activities in an effort to prepare themselves to assume the role of State Committee Chair.

WHERE AS the State Committee members work to promote continuous leadership development.

WHERE AS the State Committee members should encourage the exchange and flow of information among committee members.

WHERE AS the State Committee members should foster new and different ideas while working to prevent burnout.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLED to amend the MD-1 By-Laws, Article III, section 1, line 17 as outlined in blue below:

MD-1 Constitution, Article III. Standing Committees, Section 1.

...Council Chairperson. Members of each Standing Committee shall be appointed annually, except as is hereinafter provided for the Constitution and By-Laws Committee, the Campaign and Liaison Committee, the Long Range Planning Committee and the Membership Development Committee. Each Standing Committee has a responsibility to educate and train its members for future leadership. No Standing Committee member shall serve more than three years on any Standing Committee, with exception of the GLT, GMT, GST, and Finance Committees whose members shall serve one three-year term as is provided hereinafter. Committee Chairpersons shall report regularly to the State Council as required. Any policy procedure to be adopted by a Standing Committee shall first be submitted to the State Council for its approval, and the budget of each Standing Committee which adopts a budget shall be subject to approval by the State Council. With the exception of the Long Range Planning Committee, in order to be eligible for appointment as Chairperson of a Standing Committee, the appointee shall have served as a District Chairperson of that Committee for at least one (1) year. However, in the event that no application is received for a State Chairperson position, or the Council is not in favor of any applications received for a particular committee, the Council may waive the one year eligibility requirement and appoint a Lion to fill the position.

Lions of Illinois, Inc.

Resolution To Amend the Lions of Illinois Constitution & By Laws Constitution - Article VI, State Organization, Section 4, add new paragraph.

Subject: This proposed amendment would change the location options of the Lions of Illinois Offices, also known as the State Office, currently operating as a Virtual Office and require that the State Office be located in a location that is not a private residence.

WHEREAS, the State Office maintains most any and all records related to the Lions Of Illinois, Inc. and,

WHEREAS, the Council of Governors should have access to any and all records maintained at the Lions of Illinois, Inc. office; and,

WHEREAS, the Executive Committee of the Council of Governors should have access to any and all records of the Lions of Illinois, Inc. at anytime; and,

WHEREAS, all Lions of Illinois should have access to the State Office during normal business hours; and,

WHEREAS, a Virtual State Office does not provide for such unfettered access,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT Article VI, Section 4, new paragraph be added.

The State Office shall be situated in a location not being used as a personal residence or private dwelling. Access to the State Office is to be available to all Lions of Illinois during normal State Office business hours. Access to the State Office, any and all legally permissible records, electronic or hard copy, including access to the Lions of Illinois e-mail account are to be available to the Council of Governors during normal State Office business hours.





June 2018 marked the 50th anniversary of Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) – our Foundation. 



You can only reach so far down in the bins, so you have to climb in to get to those items on the bottom.




The 40 volunteers that evening packed 6,741 pounds of food which will feed 5,618 people. Not bad for a couple hours of work.



Disasters strike all over the world, seemingly every day. Sometimes, significant disasters occur in different areas all at once. During times like this, Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) can offer support to local Lions Clubs International for their disaster relief work.

In the past few weeks, several of our constitutional areas have experienced devastating tragedy. Catastrophic floods are overwhelming the central United States and parts of Mozambique, Malawi, and Zimbabwe.

To assist local Lions in their relief efforts, LCIF initially awarded two US\$10,000 Emergency grants. As the devastating effects of this disaster have become more apparent, your Foundation has responded again with a US\$50,000 Major Catastrophe grant for the affected countries.

We are only able to offer this assistance because of your generous support. Your donations to LCIF's disaster relief fund enable us to provide Lions with the tools they need to help those who need us most.
